Malaria is a mosquito-borne infection disease caused by plasmodium. Each year, there are approximately 300-500 million cases of malaria, killing between one and three million people. About 90% of cases deaths occur in Africa. It is commonly associated with poverty. <http://www.bsebstudy.com>

Malaria is transmitted by the bite of female Anopheles mosquito. When a mosquito bites an infected person, a small amount of blood is taken, which contains malaria parasites. These develop within a mosquito, and about one week later, when the mosquito takes its next blood meal, the parasites are injected with the mosquito's saliva on to the person being bitten. After a period of between two weeks and several months spent in the liver, The malaria parasites start to multiply within red blood cells, causing symptoms that include fever and headache. In severe cases, the disease worsens leading to come and death.

The transmission of malaria can be reduced by preventing mosquito bites by distribution of inexpensive mosquito nets and insect repellents, or by mosquito control measures such as spraying insecticides.

Mohammed Rafi was a famous Indian playback singer. His career spanned four decades. He won five National Awards and six Filmfare Award. In 1967 he was honoured with the Padma Shri by the government of India.

He was the youngest of six sons of Hajji Ali Mohammed at Kotla Sultan Singh, a village near Amritsar in Punjab. Between 1950 and 1970. Rafi was the most sought-after singer in Bollywood. He sang for all the major male stars of Hindi film. In his career he sang over 26000 film songs. He was also capable of singing bhajans, ghazals, qawwalies and national song. He sang in many Indian languages including Hindi, Konkani, Urdu, Bhojpuri, Oriya, Punjabi, Bengali, Marathi, Kannada, Gujrati, Telgu, and Assamese. He also recorded a few English, Persian, Spanish and Duch song. On 31st July 1980, Rafi died at 10:50 PM following a massive heart attack. His last song was "Shaam phir kyun udaas hai dost".
